Smoking (Prohibition in Enclosed Public Places) Act 2003:

\*Came into full force on 1/12/06 to prohibit smoking in all enclosed public places as described in 3.2.2.7.

\*Ammended in 2009 [effective 1/12/2010] to prohibit smoking in outdoor eating/drinking places and at underage functions. At which point it will become the Smoke-Free Public Places Act 2003.

These ammendments also require the licencee of premises which have outdoor smoking areas follow strict requirements including:

- 1. no access to people under 18 yrs;
- 2. no food/drink served or consumed in the area;
- 3. no entertainment or gaming machines is provided or accessible;
- 4. licensee must keep an up-to-date smoking management plan outlining how environmental tobacco smoke will be minimised.

The ACT Department of Education implemented a smoke-free policy in January 2008 prohibiting smoking on the grounds (both inside and outside) of all ACT public schools.

ACT Health brought in a smoke free policy in May 2009 which prohibits smoking in any area of an ACT Health facility, including grounds or car parks, other than in an approved designated outdoor smoking area. Each ACT Health facility/campus has only one of these.

The ACT Office of Regulatory Services (ORS) undertake proactive and reactive inspections to monitor and enforce the Smoking (Prohibition in Enclosed Public Places) Act 2003 and the Tobacco Act 1927. During 2008-2009 the ORS undertook 65 tobacco licensing inspections in the ACT and 72 inspections regarding the Smoking (Prohibition in Enclosed Public Places) Act 2003. A further 170 inspections total were carried out since July 1, 2009. Of these 170, 6 were reactive and 163 were part of proactive compliance activities.

Progress made in implementing Article 12 since 2006.

Facts sheets/bulletins regarding changes to legislation are produced are produced by ACT Health and the Justice and Community Services Office of Regulatory Services to help tobacco license holders with the implementation of these changes to legislation. These include:

- 1. Tobacco Ammendment Act 2008, regarding point of sale displays.
- 2. 2005 changes regarding the use of vending machines.
- 3. prohibition of flavoured tobacco products
- 4. A guide to the sale of tobacco products in the ACT.

Education aimed toward the public as part of the 2004-2008 ACT Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drugs Stretegy included:

- 1. World 'No Tobacco' day activities during 2006,2007 and 2008 which included stalls in major shopping centres where resources and handouts were distributed.
- 2. The 'Youth Smoking Prevention Project' and the 'Youth Smoking Prevention and Cessation Resource Pack' that contains information about tobacco smoking, and is targeted at children, parents and teachers. This project has been expanded which includes funding until 2010.
- 3. ACT Health Promotion funded a University of Canberra project in 2007 'A Puff of Smoke' which investigated why teenage Canberrans (14-19 years of age) appear to have ignored anti-smoking messages and why women stop smoking in their 20s while more men take it up. The results led to recommendations about effective mechanisms for delivering smoking prevention messages to the target group. See attachments for report.
- 4. The ACT Health Promotion Grants Health Promotion Sponsorship Funding Round uses the SmokeFree message to fund sporting, arts, and cultural and recreational organisations to promote a smoking prevention-related message. Health Promotion Sponsorships are a marketing tool which promotes healthy messages with sporting, recreation and arts organisations and community events. Smoking reduction through behaviour change and the creation of healthy environments has been the primary aim of sponsorships promoting the SmokeFree message.
- 5. ACT Health is currently in the process of contracting a Consultant to undertake a 14 month pilot to support non-government alcohol and drug services and mental health services to develop and implement smokefree workplace policies which will incorporate elements of tobacco education, communication and training. This Pilot will also involve sensitization and awareness

programmes on tobacco control addressed at health workers, community workers and social workers into the future (see 3.2.6.7)

6. ACT Health Funds the ACT Cancer Council to run:

- \*Quitline
- \* Workplace smoking cessation courses, and seminars to encourage organisations to sign up to cessation courses.
- \* Community smoking cessation courses.
- \*Youth smoking cessation courses at high schools
- \* Quit skills training seminars to health professionals.

From 2008: curriculum framework for ACT schools preschool-year 10 contained mandated essential content in the area of drug education. This information is also accessible to parents and other members of the community.

From 2009: smoking cessation information and nicotine replacement therapy was offered to all ACT health employees and patients admitted to The Canberra Hospital following the introduction of ACT healths smoke free workplace policy. The introduction of this policy also included the production of a fact sheet, poster and consumer brochure.

The 2010-2014 Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drugs Strategy is currently in the community consultation phase.

- 3.2.8.5 programs on diagnosis and treatment of tobacco dependance in our health care system are the Smoke Free Pregnancy and Families Project, and the ACT Health Smoke Free Workplace Policy.
- 3.2.8.6 These two programs provide diagnosis and treatment of tobacco dependance in primary health care settings through Public birthing services in the ACT, or to employees of ACT Health. NRT on its own is offered to patients admitted to the Canberra Hospital, but not through a program of such.
- 3.2.8.7 The cost of NRT offered to patients is fully covered by ACT Health. However, ACT Health only covers the costs while the person is admitted to the hospital as it is actually as part of the ACT Health Smoke free policy which prohibits smoking on all grounds of the hospital campus. ACT Health staff are offered free NRT for three months and this can be extended further if need be.
- 3.2.8.8 Training was provided to the following health professionals as part of the Smoke Free Pregnancy and Families Project.
- \*midwives
- \*Staff in paediatrics and centre for newborn care
- \*maternal and child health nurses
- \*GP's and practice nurse who provide pre conceptual care.

As part of ACT Healths smoke free workplace policy, training was provided to technical and pharmacy staff who dispense NRT to assess and act as contacts for ACT Health staff who wish to quit smoking.

3.2.8.10 - NRT is offered to ACT Health employees for three months. NRT

	is offered to patients for the time they are admitted to hospital only.
	3.2.8.11 - NRT is the only available treatment offered.
	Other progress in implementing Article 14 in the past 3 years.
	Throughout 2006-2010, Youth smoking prevention project (renamed ACT Vulnerable Youth: Reducing Chronic Disease Risk Factors) which is funded by ACT Health developed the youth smoking prevention and cessation resource pack (released in 2007) which contains information about tobacco smoking, and is targeted at children/parents and teachers.
	ACT Health is currently in the process of planning two pilot projects 1) a 14 month pilot to support non-government alcohol and drug services and mental health services to develop and implement smokefree workplace policies;
	2) a nine month pilot workplace health promotion program which will address, amongst other health issues, tobacco use. Both pilots will offer staff in these workplaces with support for smoking cessation. As neither of these pilots are at implementation stage, they have not been reflected in responses within Section 3.2.8 above.
