

HUMAN RIGHTS IN THE TOBACCO CONTROL FRAMEWORK



Recalling Article 12 of the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights, adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on 16 December 1966, which states that it is the right of everyone to the enjoyment of the highest attainable standard of physical and mental health



Recalling the human rights reflected in the WHO FCTC and acknowledging the relationship between tobacco use and human rights

HUMAN RIGHTS: THE ARGUMENT

Everyone has a right to life and to health

Governments have a duty to enforce those rights

Governments therefore have a duty to protect their citizens from the tobacco industry and harms from tobacco

HRC RESOLUTION 37/24



- Decides to organize two one-day intersessional meetings for dialogue and cooperation on human rights and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development
- ... to voluntarily share good practices, achievements, challenges and lessons learned in the promotion and protection of human rights and the implementation of the 2030 Agenda
- the focus of each of the above-mentioned meetings will reflect the stated themes of the 2019 and 2020 high-level political forums on sustainable development
- Goal 3 on Health and target 3 a will be among the themes of the 2020 high-level political forums
- This presents a unique opportunity to present the FCTC and implementation of Art 6 as a best practice tool to protect human rights and while making progress towards the 2030 development agenda
