

Average implementation rates (%) by Parties of substantive articles (n=180 in 2016; n=181 in 2018)








Protection from exposure to tobacco smoke (Article 8)



Average implementation rates (%) by Parties of substantive articles (n=180 in 2016; n=181 in 2018)











Tobacco growing and the environment








